STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 300, § 3, ¶ 2, amended. Paragraph 2 of section 3 of chapter 300 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Said commission may shall employ, subject to the approval of the governor and council such elerical and other assistants, and make such expenditures, as may be necessary to carry into effect the purposes of this act, and subject to the same approval may fix the compensation of all such employees or assistants. All appointments of individuals as employees or agents or the commission shall take effect only on confirmation by the governor and council. after due examination and inquiry determine the merit, efficiency and fitness of all applicants for positions prepare a properly classified eligible list from applicants so examined, and from such eligible list employ such clerical help and other assistants and employees and make such expenditures as may be necessary to carry into effect the purposes of this act and subject to the approval of the governor and council fix the compensation of all such employees or assistants.'
