AN ACT Relating to Snow Removal from Airports.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 28, § 52, amended. Section 52 of chapter 28 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 52. State highway commission may on petition lay out winter routes to be cleared of snow. The commission, on petition of the municipal officers of 2 or more towns through which extends a continuous state or state aid highway or town way, may from year to year lay out winter routes over such state or state aid highways or town ways as in their judgment seem advisable for the clearance of snow therefrom for the reasonable use of motor vehicles, sleighs, and sleds during such season. The commission may take similar action upon petition of the municipal officers of any town with respect to any other highways or town ways. **Runways on airports shall be construed as town ways within the meaning of the provisions of sections 52 to 61 inclusive, except that they shall not be subject to limitations as to width, but shall be cleared to their full width; and the clearance of an airport runway shall be considered for the purposes of sections 52 to 61 inclusive, as the equivalent of 3½ miles of highway.** All snow removal petitions are to be received in the office of the commission on or before November 1st, previous to the season's work.'
