STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Regulate the Sale of Fuel Oil.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Issuance of certificate. Any person, firm or corporation in the state who shall sell or deliver fuel oil in quantities of 10 gallons or over for heating or cooking purposes shall issue and deliver a certificate or memorandum to the purchaser or his agent, at the time of delivery of said oil. Such certificate or memorandum shall include the name and address of the seller and the purchaser, and a statement of the quantity of oil delivered in terms of gallons and fractions thereof, if any.

Sec. 2. Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this act, or shall neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 for the 1st offense, and by a fine of not more than \$200 for each subsequent offense.

Sec. 3. Jurisdiction. Municipal courts and trial justices shall have original jurisdiction concurrent with the superior court of action brought for recovery of penalties imposed by this act and prosecutions for violation hereof.
