STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Public Records.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 96, additional. Chapter 96 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 134-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 134-A. Public records may be made by photographic process; admissibility. Public records may be made by photographic process when the instrument is required by law to be recorded and copies made by photographic process from public records shall be received as evidence in the courts of this state, under existing laws, if duly attested by the officials required by law to keep said records.'
