STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Cusk.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 29, amended. Paragraph 4 of section 29 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Provided, further, that it shall be lawful to take minnows and other fish usually used for bait for fishing, in all the inland waters of the state for bait for fishing only in the state; and provided, further, that it shall be lawful to fish for and take white fish with single hook and line, in the daytime in the waters of the state during such time as the waters fished in are open to fishing for salmon, trout and togue, and provided, further, that it shall be lawful to fish for and take cusk in the nighttime during such period as the waters fished in are open to fishing for salmon, trout and togue, with not more than 5 set lines to each person when fishing through the ice and when under the immediate supervision of the person fishing.'
