STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of William C. Boyles, of Castle Hill.

William C. Boyles; compensated for damage done by bears. Resolved:
That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$120.00 in favor of William C. Boyles, of Castle Hill, to compensate him for damage done to his bees and crops by bears, said sum to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On the night of September 22, 1933, 4 bears completely destroyed 11 swarms of bees, 11 hives and supers, 950 lbs. of honey; and shook the apples from about 50 trees, trampling and chewing them so they could not be sold; and Mr. Boyles sustained a loss from the sale of apples from other trees. Warden Higgins assisted Mr. Boyles, and together they shot one bear and caught another.
