**RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey Certain Lands
to the Highway Commission.**

Forest commissioner authorized to convey certain lands to highway commission. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to grant and convey to the highway commission whatever interest the state has in a certain parcel of land, to wit:

A parcel of land consisting of a right of way 4 rods in width located in Taunton-Raynham township, beginning at the north line of land now or formerly owned by Coburn Heirs, Inc. at Station 629+03.2, thence on a course of N 9°-56' E to P. C. Station 633+61.6; thence on a 6° curve to the left to P. T. Station 636+08.8, thence on a course of N 4°-54' W to the West Outlet of the Kennebec river at about Station 662+25.0 and containing 4.93 acres, more or less.

The above described line is the center line of said 4 rods right of way being 2 rods on each side of said line as measured at right angles and normal thereto.

Said right of way is designated as parcel No. 2 on a plan entitled "Proposed Location State Aid Highway No. 2," dated July, 1933, and recorded in Somerset county register of deeds, to which plan reference may be had for a more particular description.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The road built by the highway department from Greenville to Rockwood crosses one of the school lots in Township 1, Range 1, N. B. K. P., Somerset county, locally known as Taunton-Raynham Township. The land of this township is held in trust by the state for said township, and the legislature alone has the right to deed.
