RESOLVE, Relating to Ice Fishing in Eagle and St. Froid Lakes.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the inhabitants of the territory surrounding Eagle and St. Froid lakes are without employment, and the relief burden thereby imposed on the surrounding towns is more than they can bear, and

Whereas, if the inhabitants of the aforesaid territory could fish in Eagle, and St. Froid lakes, they could obtain food and thus relieve the burden of welfare relief, and,

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, now, therefore, be it

Eagle, and St. Froid lakes, opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Eagle lake and St. Froid lake in Aroostook county to ice fishing for smelts from January 1 of each year until

the ice goes out in the spring. This rule and regulation shall remain in effect until otherwise ordered by the legislature.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble hereof, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
