STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relative to Trapping in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 72-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 72-A. Trapping prohibitive in certain territory; exception; penalty. Trapping for all animals is hereby prohibited in that portion of York county which is bounded as follows: on the north by federal highway No. 1, on the west by the Mousam river and on the east by the Saco river, and on the south by the Atlantic ocean. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit the commissioner from regulating the trapping of vermin or other predatory animals upon any game preserve within the above described territory. Whoever violates any provisions of this section shall be subject to the penalty provided for in section 107.'
