STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Carrabassett River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1931, c. 277, § 59, amended. Section 59 of chapter 277 of the laws of Maine 1931 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 59. Fishing in Carrabassett river and tributaries regulated. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Carrabassett river, and in all tributaries, direct and indirect, above the falls at East New Portland, except in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly-fishing, so-called, with the following further exceptions: (a) The main stream of the West Branch of said Carrabassett river, exclusive of tributaries thereto, up as far as, and including ~~these parts of Dead and Quick Streams, so-called, which are below the road leading from Salem to Phillips,~~ the Salem mill pond, and Lemon stream, shall be open to plug or bait fishing; and (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in ~~Dead and Quick streams, so-called, above the road leading from Salem to Phillips,~~ **which run into the Salem mill pond, in all tributaries of Rapid stream including the east and west branches above the Forks, so-called,** or in as much of the north branch of the Carrabassett river as lies above the bridges at Bigelow on the road leading from Kingfield to Stratton; provided, further, that it shall be unlawful for any person to catch and kill a

trout less than 7 inches in length, or more than 15 fish in all in any one day, in the waters described in this section which are open to fishing. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of fish at any time taken in violation of any provision of this section.
