#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Relating to Bail Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 113, § 34, amended. Section 34 of chapter 113 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 34. Bail commissioners appointed by court; limitations. The superior court, sitting in each county shall appoint from the number of justices of the peace resident in the county, one or more bail commissioners, who shall hold office during the pleasure of the court. All bail commissioners acting under an appointment by a justice of the supreme judicial court shall continue in office during the pleasure of the superior court. No judge, clerk or recorder of any municipal court, or any trial justice, who is also a bail commissioner, shall act in his capacity as bail commissioner in any case wherein the process is made returnable to his court.'
