STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Augustus S. Burke, and R. Bourbeau, of Fairfield, to Compensate Them for Land Taken for Sewer Appurtenant to Central Maine Sanatorium.

Augustus S. Burke and R. Bourbeau, of Fairfield, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$75, to be paid to Augustus S. Burke and R. Bourbeau, of Fairfield, to compensate them for land taken in 1917 for the construction of a sewer leading from Central Maine Sanatorium, said sum to be paid from the funds of the Central Maine Sanatorium appropriation.

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STATEMENT OF FACTS

These claimants jointly owned land adjacent to Central Maine Sanatorium. In 1917, the state, through the trustees of the sanatorium, built a sewer to carry waste from the sanatorium to the Kennebec river, and this sewer crossed the land of claimants, as well as other lands. There was some attempt by the trustees and claimants to determine damages, but no agreement was ever entered into. The 2 claimants, Burke and Bourbeau, are now dissolving their partnership venture. Burke has always been the active partner, and he is accounting to Bourbeau. The amount of compensation which should have been collected is an item in the account. Claimants have never received any payment in any form.
