RESOLVE, in Favor of Harold F. Wing of Bingham.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$125 to be paid to Harold F. Wing of Bingham, for remuneration for turkeys killed by an eagle; said sum to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Wing who resides at Bingham, had placed on an island belonging to him on the Kennebec river, 200 turkeys. Sixty-three of these were killed by an eagle. Most of them were half grown, and one turkey which cost Mr. Wing \$25 was so badly injured that it died 2 days after the eagle's attack.

Mr. Wing took this matter up with the inland fisheries and game department, and was advised by them not to shoot the eagle, and in fact, they detailed wardens there. Unsuccessful attempts were made to trap the eagle.
