STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Licenses for Wholesalers in Malt Beverages.

Amend said bill by adding thereto the following:

Chapter 268 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby further amended by adding after section 8, in said chapter, the following 2 sections:

Sec. 8-A. Certificates of approval. No licensee under this act shall purchase any malt liquor from any manufacturer or wholesaler not holding a permit issued under the provisions of this act, and transport or cause the same to be transported into the state of Maine for resale unless such manufacturer or wholesaler has obtained from the state liquor commission a certificate of approval which certificate shall not be granted unless and until such manufacturer or wholesaler shall have agreed with the state liquor commission to furnish to the commission on or before the 10th day of each month a report under oath on a form to be prescribed by the commission, showing the quantity of malt liquor sold or delivered to each licensee during the preceding calendar month. If any such manufacturer or wholesaler shall, after obtaining such certificate, fail to submit any such report the commission may in its discretion revoke such certificate.

Sec. 8-B. Fee for certificate of approval. The fee for a certificate of approval issued pursuant to the provisions of this act shall be \$500 per annum, which sum shall accompany the application for such certificate.
