IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

RESOLVE, Relative to the Digging of Clams in Mount Desert.

Digging of clams in Mount Desert, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue the following rule and regulation:

'It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of or riparian owner in the town of Mount Desert, in the county of Hancock, to dig clams within the limits of said town. Any person residing therein or the riparian owner of any clam flats may take therefrom not exceeding 5 bushels of clams in 1 day. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions hereof shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
