**RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Winnifred Parker of
Presque Isle.**

Winnifred Parker; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$15 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Winnifred Parker, of Presque Isle, to be paid from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1935, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Parker is the widow of Lee Parker, a fish and game warden who was shot and killed while in the performance of his duty by one Henry Wood. She is crippled by rheumatism and confined to a wheel chair. She was deprived of her only support when her husband was killed.
