STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Ethel M. Parker, of Portland.

Ethel M. Parker, appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$2,500 to be paid to the department of health and welfare to be used in the discretion of said department for the benefit of Ethel M. Parker, of Portland, widow of Herbert C. Parker, who was killed by an inmate of the state school for boys while endeavoring to capture said inmate as he attempted to make his escape from the institution. In the event of death of said Ethel M. Parker, any unexpended balance of said fund in excess of burial expenses shall be paid to the treasurer of state, said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On June 7, 1933, Leslie Stover, an inmate of the state school for boys, attempted to escape from the institution. Herbert C. Parker, a former officer, attempted to capture Stover who shot Mr. Parker, inflicting injuries from which he died the following day.
