AN ACT to Establish a Boundary Line for the Town of Fayette.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Boundary line for Fayette established. The boundary line of the town of Fayette shall be, and hereby is, established as follows, to wit: Beginning at the northeast corner of the town of Livermore Falls, thence southerly as marked by stone monuments recognized and accepted as town line markers by said towns of Fayette and Livermore Falls to the north line of the town of Wayne; thence easterly as marked by stone monuments recognized and accepted by Wayne and Fayette as town line markers to the westerly shore of Lovejoy (Lane's) pond; thence on the same course to the easterly shore of Lovejoy (Lane's) pond; thence northerly by the shore of said Lovejoy (Lane's) pond to the most easterly and northerly point thereof; thence northerly through a stone monument standing on the south side of the road leading from Fayette Mills to Kent's Hill and marked "T. L.—1901-1911" "F" on west side and "R" on east side, to a stone monument on the southerly shore of the southeast branch of Crotched pond, and marked "T. L.—1901-1911" "F" on west side and "R" on east side; thence northerly through the middle of the channel at the northerly end of Crotched pond and continuing same course to the south line of the town of Mt. Vernon; thence westerly in the south line of Mt. Vernon to

the southwest corner of Mt. Vernon; thence northerly in the west line of Mt. Vernon to the stream draining Parker's pond; thence by said stream to Parker's pond; thence by the southerly and the westerly shores of said pond to the south line of Chesterville; thence westerly in the south line of Chesterville as shown by stone monuments marking said line to the first mentioned bound.
