STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Umbagog Lake.

Fishing in Umbagog lake, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue the following rules and regulations: (1) That the waters of Umbagog lake in Oxford county shall be closed to all ice fishing.

(2) That it shall be unlawful for any 1 person to take, catch and kill more than 5 pounds of trout, salmon and white fish in any 1 day from the waters of Umbagog lake and for all the occupants of any 1 boat, canoe, raft or other vessel, that it shall be unlawful to take, catch or kill from said Umbagog lake, more than 10 pounds of trout, salmon and white fish in any 1 day, unless the weight of the last fish caught shall increase the total weight of the catch to more than the limits above specified.

(3) That any boat or boats in tow from another boat or hitched to another boat, for the purposes of these regulations shall be considered as 1 unit and the limitations provided herein shall apply to all the occupants of such boats thus hitched together as if they occupied but 1 boat.
