## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Clams in the Town of Roque Bluffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1923, c. 65. § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 65 of the Drivate and special laws of 1923 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 1. Limited to residents. Except as hereinafter provided, it shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of the town of Roque Bluffs in the county of Washington to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town, but this act shall not apply to that portion of said town beginning on the northerly side of Bear Point Cove on the westerly shore of Little Kennebec bay and extending northerly therefrom to the Machias town line.'
