## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

House Amendment A to Bill "An Act to Require Constables and Collectors of Taxes to be Bonded by a Surety Company" (H. P. 1175, L. D. 381.)

Amend said Bill by striking out all after the enacting clause and substituting in place thereof the following:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 14, § 14, amended. Section 14 of chapter 14 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 14. Bond of collector; furnished by town. The assessors shall require such constable or collector annually to give bond underwritten executed by a surety company authorized to do business in this state for the faithful discharge of his duty, to the inhabitants of the town, in such sum, and with such sureties, as the municipal officers approve; and the bonds of collectors of plantations shall be given to the inhabitants thereof, approved by the assessors, with like conditions. The bond required by this section shall be furnished under the direction of the municipal officers at the expense of the town.'
