AN ACT Relating to Applications for Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 29, further amended. Chapter 29 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 139 of the public laws of 1935, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 33-A. Operators' licenses issued, only when poll taxes have been paid. No person required by law to pay a poll tax in this state shall be granted an operator's license unless ~~his poll tax for the previous year has~~ **all of his poll taxes in arrears have** been paid.

To facilitate the administration of this act, the secretary of state shall cause to be placed on the application blank for an operator's license the following question: "Have you paid your poll ~~tax for the previous year~~ **taxes to date?"**'
