STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Designating Columbus Day a Legal Holiday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 91, § 77, amended. Section 77 of chapter 91 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 77. Legal holidays. No court shall be held on Sunday, or any day designated for the annual thanksgiving, or for the choice of presidential electors, New Year's day, January 1st, Washington's birthday, February 22nd, the 19th day of April, the 30th day of May, the 4th day of July, the 1st Monday of September, the day of the state election, Columbus day, October 12th, Armistice day, November 11th, or on Christmas day; and when the time fixed for a term of court falls on either of said days, it shall stand adjourned until the next day which shall be deemed the 1st day of the term for all purposes. The public offices in county buildings may be closed to business on the above named holidays. When any one of the above named holidays falls on Sunday, the Monday following shall be observed as a holiday, with all the privileges applying to any of the days above named.'
