STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Relating to Taking of Clams in Harrington.

Resolved: Taking clams in Harrington, regulated. That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation forbiding any person not a resident of the town of Harrington, in the county of Washington, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
