**RESOLVE, in Favor of Harry C. Libby, of Portland.**

---

Whereas, on the 14th day of September, 1935, Herbert J. Welch, late of Portland, in the county of Cumberland and state of Maine, deceased, was the duly appointed and qualified judge of the Portland Municipal Court, and Harry C. Libby, of said Portland, was the duly appointed and qualified recorder of said Portland Municipal Court; and

Whereas, on the night of September 14th, 1935, said Herbert J. Welch became deceased; and

Whereas, on September 16th, 1935, said Harry C. Libby, under the provisions of chapter 253 of the public laws of 1915 of the state, assumed the powers and duties of the judge of said court and exercised the powers and performed the duties of said judge until the 5th day of March, 1936; and

Whereas, said Harry C. Libby has received no compensation from the county of Cumberland for the exercise of said powers and performance of said duties; now, therefore, be it

**Resolved: Harry C. Libby, compensated.** That said Harry C. Libby be compensated by Cumberland county for the exercise of extra duty as acting

judge of the Portland Municipal Court for the period from said September 16th, 1935 to said March 5th, 1936, at the rate of \$2,200 per annum, being the legal salary of the judge of said court.
