**AN ACT to Enlarge the Powers of the Trustees of Wilton Academy, a  
Corporation Chartered by the State to Hold Property.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. & S. L., 1866, c. 6, § 1, amended.** Section 1 of chapter 6 of the private and special laws of 1866 is hereby amended to read as follows:

**'Sec. 1. Trustees of Wilton Academy incorporated.** Joshua Adams, James N. Hall, David Clark, J. M. Hiscock, S. B. Walker, A. Russell, J. S. Greenwood, E. V. Packard, Alonzo Boothby, Columbus Gray, M. R. Walker, R. B. Fuller, Edward Clark, William H. Strout, J. B. Green, George Gage, J. R. Eaton, D. Furnel, Enoch Scales and H. D. Marble, their associates and ~~successors~~ **assigns**, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Trustees of ~~the~~ Wilton Academy; said academy to be located at Wilton in the county of Franklin; and by that name may sue and be sued; have a common seal; enact any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this state; choose such officers as they may deem expedient; ~~receive by donation or otherwise, any estate, real or personal, the annual income of which shall not exceed two thousand dollars; take and hold any property, heretofore given, or that hereafter may be given to said academy,~~

to have and to hold by gift, grant, devise, bequest or otherwise, property and estate to any amount, whether real, personal, or mixed, whether now owned by said corporation or hereafter acquired, and to give, grant, bargain, sell or lease the same, and apply the avails of such property exclusively to the promotion of education; and any 3 of the above named trustees, may call the 1st meeting of said corporation.
