RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in the Waters of Rangeley Lake Region.

Fishing in Rangeley Lake Region, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Rangeley lake, Quimby pond, Dodge pond, Haley pond, Saddleback lake, Kennebago lake, all in the county of Franklin; Long pond in Sandy River Plantation, county of Franklin; and Cup-suptic lake and Mooselucmeguntic lake, counties of Franklin and Oxford; to fishing from October 1st until the ice is out the following spring; provided, however, that if the ice is not out of said waters by May 1st said waters shall be legally opened to fishing on that date.
