RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams Within the Town of Islesboro.

Taking of clams in Islesboro, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation, except an inhabitant of the town of Islesboro, shall take more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any 1 day from within the limits of the tide-waters of the town of Islesboro. Whoever violates any provision of this resolve shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200.
