A N A C T R e l a t i n g t o B o x i n g C o n t e s t s .

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 134, § 5, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 5 of chapter 134 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'And section 4 shall not apply to purely boxing contests consisting of not more than ~~six~~ 10 rounds, of 3 minutes each, in which new 6-ounce gloves are used which have not been broken, or tampered with by pushing back the padding from the knuckles of said gloves, and where there is not more than 5 pounds difference in the weight of the contestants and where contestants have had a rigid physical examination by a reputable physician just prior to said contest and said physician certifies that each of said contestants is in good physical condition; ~~and in which contest no decision is given.~~'
