STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Revocation of Fish and Game Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 107-A, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered section 107-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 107-A. Penalties for violations of fish and game laws. The commissioner shall revoke the license to hunt and (or) fish of any person who has been convicted of a violation of the fish and game laws, or the rules and regulations of the commissioner for a period of 6 months. On any 2nd conviction of the same person, the commissioner shall revoke or refuse to issue a license to the said person for a period of 18 months. On any 3rd conviction of the same person, the commissioner shall revoke or refuse to issue a license to the said person for a period of 3 years. On any 4th conviction of the same person, the commissioner shall revoke or refuse to issue a license to the said person for a period of 5 years. On any 5th conviction of the same person, the commissioner shall revoke or refuse to issue a license to the said person for a period of 5 years. On any 5th conviction of the same person, the commissioner shall refuse to issue a license to the said person for a period of 5 years. No license shall be issued to any person after a 5th conviction except after a hearing before the commissioner.'
