STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Establishing the York Game Sanctuary in the Plantation of Dallas in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Game preserve established in the plantation of Dallas, in the county of Franklin. No person shall at any time, hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal within the following named territory; on the property of the following named persons, to wit: on land of J. Lewis York and on land of Yorks; said game sanctuary being in the northwest corner of Dallas Plantation, and bounded as follows, to wit: west by the east line of the town of Rangeley; north by the south line of Lang Plantation; east by the west line of the public lot in Dallas Plantation; and south by land of Furbish, Goodspeed Company and land of the heirs of Henry Bliss, containing 539 acres, more or less.

Sec. 2. Name. This game sanctuary shall be called the York game sauctuary.

Sec. 3. Penalties for violations. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the general penalties provided in section 107 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, for violations of the fish and game laws, and acts additional thereto and amendatory thereof.
