STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Issuance of Operators' Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 29, § 33, amended. The 1st 2 sentences of section 33 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Applications to operate motor vehicles shall be presented by mail or otherwise to the secretary of state upon blanks prepared under his authority, and which shall therein call for specific answers to questions of a character designed to show the experience and competency of the applicant to operate a motor vehicle; a fee of \$2 shall accompany the application. Before the license is granted, an applicant may shall be required to pass such examination by actual demonstration or otherwise as to his qualifications to operate a motor vehicle as the said secretary chief of the state police shall require, if the applicant has not previously held a license; and in case the applicant is 75 years or older, a new examination shall be given every 2 years; and no license shall be issued until the said secretary chief is satisfied that the applicant is a proper person to receive it; no license shall be issued to any person under fifteen 16 years of age.'
