## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Members of Maine Development Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 2, § 113-A, amended. Section 113-A of chapter 2 of the revised statutes, as allocated by chapter 190 of the public laws of 1935, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 113-A. Maine development commission; how constituted. There is hereby created and established a board of 10 members which shall be known as the Maine Development Commission. Said commission shall be constituted as follows: the governor, the commissioner of agriculture, the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries, I member of the Maine Publicity Bureau, I member of the Associated Industries of Maine, I member of the Maine Hotel Association, I outstanding member of newspaper profession in Maine, I outstanding member of political party casting the next largest number of votes in the last election for presidential electors, and 2 I other citizens of the state. All appointive members of the commission shall be appointed by the governor and confirmed by the council. Said official members shall hold office during their respective terms. Of the 7 other herein designated appointees, 4 shall hold office for 2 years, and 3 for 3 years; and thereafter The other appointments shall be for a term of 3 years.'
