# STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

#### AN ACT to Close Hunting in Certain Territory in Sagadahoc County to be Known as the "Old Mill Pond Game Preserve," in Phippsburg.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Old Mill Pond game preserve, established. No person shall at any time hunt, chase, pursue, catch, shoot at, kill or destroy any migratory wild fowl in the "Old Mill Pond," so-called, located in the northern end of the town of Phippsburg, and within the following described boundary in said town of Phippsburg, in the county of Sagadahoc: Bounded on the north by the Old Mill Pond dam, so-called; on the east by land of Fred L. Parks' heirs and land of J. H. Blaisdell; on the south by James L. Morse; on the west by land of James L. Morse, George E. Coggeshall and John G. Morse & Sons. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in his possession at any time any migratory wild fowl, alive or dead, or part thereof, taken or killed in violation of any provision of this section.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$100 and costs for each offense, or by imprisonment for 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
