## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Advertising of the Products of Maine Sea and Shore Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 2, § 113-B, amended. Section 113-B of chapter 2 of the revised statutes, as created by chapter 190 of the public laws of 1935, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 113-B. Appropriations; duties of commission. The sum of \$100,000 is hereby annually appropriated for the purpose of advertising and publicly setting forth and displaying agricultural, industrial and recreational resources, activities and attractions of the state, of which sum \$25,000 shall be expended for the purpose of advertising the agricultural products of the state, and \$25,000 for the purpose of advertising the sea and shore fishing products of the state. The commission shall arrange for, authorize and supervise the expenditure of all money appropriated under this section and shall have full authority to execute contracts for the preparation, publication, dissemination and furnishing of information incidental to the purposes of this act. The members of the commission may be recompensed for their expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, but shall not receive any salary. Expenditures authorized by this act shall be paid for only on vouchers approved by the commission and the state controller.'
