## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

#### AN ACT Providing for a Recorder of South Portland Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1933, c. 18, amended. Chapter 18 of the private and special laws of 1933, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Item VIII. Salary of judge; recorder provided for; salary. The judge of said court shall receive a salary of \$800 per year from the 1st day of January, 1925, to be paid him in quarterly payments from the county treasury of Cumberland county which shall be in full for the services as such judge. All blanks, civil and criminal, dockets and record books, required by said court, shall be furnished by the county of Cumberland. Said judge shall have authority to appoint some suitable person to act as elerk of said court whose duty it shall be to prepare and keep the records of said court and perform such other duties as the judge of said court may direct and who shall receive a salary of \$300 each year to be paid in quarterly payments from the county treasury of Cumberland county which shall be in full for services as such elerk. There shall be a recorder of said court who shall possess the same qualifications and be appointed in the same manner as the judge. He shall prepare and keep the records of the court. He shall perform all the duties of the judge but only when requested to do so by said judge or during his temporary absence or disability, or when a vacancy exists in the office of said judge. The recorder shall receive a salary of \$300 per year.'

Sec. 2. Amending clause. This act shall be valid and effective, any provision of chapter 242 of the private and special laws of 1895, and amendments thereto, inconsistent herewith, notwithstanding.'
