IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to the Powers of the Clerk of the Municipal Court of
Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1871, c. 636, § 13, amended. Section 13 of chapter 636 of the private and special laws of 1871, as amended, is hereby amended by striking out all of said section and inserting the following in place thereof:

‘Sec. 13. Powers of clerk defined. When the office of judge shall be vacant, or the judge absent, the clerk shall finish the business pending before the court, and shall have jurisdiction over all new business and carry on the business of the court during any vacancy in the office of judge, or the judge’s absence. The clerk shall further have and enjoy all the powers and privileges during his term of office that are now accorded to the judge.’

Sec. 2. Repealing law. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
