STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Manzie I. Rogers, of Bangor, Maine.

Manzie I. Rogers, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$15,000 in favor of Manzie I. Rogers, of Bangor, to reimburse him for a loss sustained in the year 1932 in the building of a road in the towns of Carmel and Hermon, route 2, so-called, said sum to be paid from the general highway funds.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In the year of 1932 the said Rogers entered into a contract with the state of Maine to build the above described road. The state through the highway department had opened a gravel pit near by the construction job and felt that the said pit would be adequate and suitable for this job, and suggested it to said Rogers who also was of the same opinion. There was no other pits available in the vicinity. Rogers started upon the contract and used the pit. Almost immediately it became apparent that the pit was not suitable, and this necessitated an additional expense to Rogers of more than \$15,000.
