**RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams in Bar Harbor.**

---

**Taking of clams in Bar Harbor, regulated. Resolved:** That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of or riparian owner in the town of Bar Harbor, in the county of Hancock, to dig clams within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
