STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relative to Transportation of Fish and Game by Aeroplane.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 81, amended. Section 81 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 81. Fish and game; transportation of by aeroplane. All aeroplanes leaving the state of Maine with either fish or game must have a certificate showing that they have been inspected by a warden, and it shall be unlawful for any person to transport or attempt to transport beyond the limits of this state by aeroplane any fish or game which has not been inspected by a warden.'
