STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to State Dairymen's Conference.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 39, § 6, amended. Section 6 of chapter 39 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 6. To hold a state dairymen's conference, and state seed improvement meeting. He shall, in connection with, and with the aid of the Maine dairymen's association, annually hold a state dairymen's conference for the exhibit of cattle, dairy products and appliances, wherein prizes for high merit and quality in butter and cheese may be offered, and may employ experts and lecturers to enhance dairy interests, but the expenses of the same shall not exceed the sum of \$700 annually. He shall also in connection with, and with the aid of the Maine seed improvement association, annually hold a state seed improvement meeting for the exhibition of seeds adapted to the soil of Maine, wherein prizes for high merit in quality and variety may be offered, and may employ experts and lecturers to advocate the use of improved seed by the farmers of the state, but the total expense for such prizes and lecturers shall not exceed the sum

of one thousand dollars annually. He may also in connection with, and with the aid of the several poultry associations of the state offer prizes for excellence in displays of poultry and poultry products, but the amount of the same shall not exceed the sum of \$1,000 annually.'
