STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Providing that Employers of 4 or More Persons Shall be Subject to the Unemployment Compensation Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. L., 1935, c. 192, § 19, amended. Subsection (f) of section 19 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Employer" means: (1) Any employing unit which for some portion of a day, but not necessarily simultaneously, in each of 20 different weeks, whether or not such weeks are or were consecutive, within either the current or the preceding calendar year, has or had in employment, 8 4 or more individuals (irrespective of whether the same individuals are or were employed in each such day),

Effective date. This act shall become effective on January I, 1938.
