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AN ACT Relating to Motor Vehicles.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. L., 1935, c. 129, amended.** Chapter 129 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Every ~~commercial~~ motor vehicle **and every trailer having a carrying capacity of 2 tons or over** shall be equipped with at least 1 adequate reflector securely attached to the rear thereof. Such reflector may be a part of the rear lamp, and shall in all cases be red. No reflector shall be deemed adequate unless it is so designed, located and maintained as to reflect at night on an unlighted highway, for at least 200 feet, the lawful undimmed headlights of a vehicle approaching from the rear thereof, **provided, however, that this act shall not become effective until November 1, 1937.**'
