**RESOLVE, in Favor of Eleanor Blauvelt Compensating her for the Death
of Her Husband.**

Eleanor Blauvelt, of Portland, compensated. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of \$5000 to be paid to Eleanor Blauvelt of Portland to compensate her for the death of her husband Harry Blauvelt formerly a clerk in the state liquor store of Portland whose death was caused by a fall in said liquor store due to improper equipment in said liquor store; said amount to be paid from the funds of the Maine liquor commission.

STATEMENT

Harry Blauvelt was a clerk in the state liquor store in Portland, Maine. Because of lack of a chair upon which to sit in the performance of his duties in such liquor store two boxes were piled one on the other to provide him with a place to sit. Through the slipping of said boxes he fell to the floor, was rendered unconscious and died within a few hours thereafter. His death occurred on the fifth day of September 1936.
