STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Increasing the Penalty for Conspiracy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 138, § 26, amended. Section 26 of chapter 138 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 26. Conspiracies in other cases; penalty. If 2 or more persons conspire and agree together, with the fraudulent or malicious intent wrongfully and wickedly to injure the person, character, business, or property of another; or for one or more of them to sell intoxicating liquor in this state in violation of law to I or more of the others; or to do any illegal act injurious to the public trade, health, morals, police, or administration of public justice; or to commit a crime punishable by imprisonment in the state prison, they are guilty of a conspiracy, and every such offender, and every person convicted of conspiracy at common law, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1000, or by imprisonment for not more than three 10 years.'
