RESOLVE, Opening All Tributaries of Belgrade Lakes and Messalonskee Lake to Fishing.

Fishing in Belgrade lakes and Messalonskee lake, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening all tributaries of Belgrade lakes and Messalonskee lake, to fishing, provided, however, that no fish taken shall be less than 7 inches in length, and provided further that not more than 6 fish shall be taken by any 1 person in any 1 day.
