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**AN ACT Relating to Practice before Probate Courts.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 95, § 2, amended.** The 2nd paragraph of section 2 of chapter 95 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Clerks of the judicial courts, **judges, recorders and clerks of the probate courts**, clerks and recorders of the municipal courts and trial justices of the state shall not sell or deliver any blank writs or precepts bearing the seal of said courts and the signature of said **judges**, clerks, recorders and trial justices, to any person except one who has been admitted as an attorney and counselor at law, and solicitor and counselor in chancery in accordance with the laws of this state, and **said judge, recorder and clerk of the probate courts of this state shall not receive any paper petition or other instrument pertaining to the practice of law before said probate court unless it bears the endorsement of an attorney or counselor at law, duly authorized to practice before said court.**’
