**AN ACT To Create Reservoir No. 1 Game Preserve and Game Preserve  
Reservoir No. 2.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 38, § 90, amended.** Section 90 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by inserting immediately after the paragraph caption "Natanis Game Preserve", a new paragraph, as follows:

**'Reservoir No. 1 and Reservoir No. 2.** No person shall at any time hunt, chase, kill, catch or destroy any wild bird, wild animal or fish in or upon any of the waters embraced within the limits of Reservoir No. 1 in Belfast, consisting of an area beginning on Atlantic highway No. 1 at Little River on the land owned by the Belfast water district and comprises 81.92 acres of which 34.57 acres are flooded; balance being watershed surrounding reservoir; or within the limits of Reservoir No. 2 in Belfast, consisting of an area beginning at the bridge over Little River located on Lower Congress Street and the road known as the Perkins road. This area contains 125.37 acres of which 40 acres are flooded. The balance surrounding the reservoir which forms its banks and also a part of its watershed is owned by the Belfast Water District. This area is flooded by a dam on Little River about 100 feet westerly and above foresaid bridge.'
