**AN ACT Relating to Over-night Parking of Trailers, Auto-homes and
House-cars.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Parking. It shall be unlawful for any person operating a trailer, auto-home or house-car, to park the same from 6 o'clock in the evening to 6 o'clock of the following morning within the limits of the highway, as established by the state, county or town, or upon private property; except that the motor vehicle to which is attached such trailer, auto-home or house-car, cannot proceed because of a breakdown. Any trailer, auto-home, or house-car so unlawfully parked shall be deemed a menace to health and a common nuisance.

Sec. 2. Licensed parking places. All filling stations, over-night camps or cabins, seashore resorts, lakeshore places, and municipal camping grounds, may be designated by the municipal officers as licensed parking places, and all such places and all public picnic and lunch grounds at all times shall be under the supervision of the public health department and subject to such rules and regulations as from time to time it may promulgate relative to the disposal of rubbish, garbage, and the use of toilet

facilities for the protection of the public health. The municipal officers of each town or city may license the foregoing places for the purposes designated, upon the payment of a fee of _____ per year for any period in any year, but ending December 31.

Sec. 3. Charges for parking. The licensees of the places mentioned in section 2 herewith may make charges for such parking but not to exceed \$1 for each period of 24 hours.

Sec. 4. Penalty. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$15.
