STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Authorizing D. M. Susi to Bring a Suit at Law Against the State of Maine.

D. M. Susi, authorized to bring suit against state. Resolved: That D. M. Susi of Pittsfield in the county of Somerset and state of Maine, who was the contractor for the construction of a concrete road in Burnham and Pittsfield and who claims that, at the direction of an authorized engineer of the state, he performed extra work and furnished additional materials than called for in the contract, for which he has not been compensated, is hereby authorized to bring suit at law within one year from the 1st day of August, 1937, in the superior court for the county of Kennebec at any term thereof, against the state of Maine, and the writ issuing out of said court under the authority of this resolve shall be served on the secretary of state by an attested copy thirty days before the return day thereof by the sheriff or either of his deputies of the county of Kennebec, and the evidence shall be taken out before a justice of said court in term time or vacation and the case reported to the supreme court sitting as a law court for final determination, and the liabilities of the parties shall be the same as the liabilities between individuals, and any judgment that may be recovered in such suit at law shall be payable from the treasury of the state of Maine on final process issued by said superior court in said suit at law out of any money not otherwise appropriated, and costs may be taxed for the said Susi if he recover in said suit.
